Theme: Into the Woods



Key Knowledge

By the end of this half term children will.

- Be able to name and identify human and physical features of our school e.g. The trees in forest school are a physical feature. The gates are a human feature.
- Be able to name and identify human and physical features of our local area e.g. Ecclesall Woods is a physical feature. The swings in Millhouses park are a human feature.
- Be able to give directions using compass points. North, South, East and West e.g. The Gruffalo is sitting to the West of the River.
- Be able to use directional language e.g. the forest school is next to the jungle walk. The Squirrels class is opposite the Hedgehog class.
- Begin to use and draw aerial maps.
- Be able to say where they live: Millhouses (or other) Sheffield, England, The United Kingdom.

GEOGRAPHICAL SKILLS AND FIELDWORK

Children will use simple observational skills and fieldwork to study the Geography of school and what they see in their environment. They will visit the local woods and record what they see. They will produce maps and label them using the compass points, and directional language to describe the map's features. They will experiment with using keys.

Key Vocabulary

Human Features: building, schools, roads, houses.

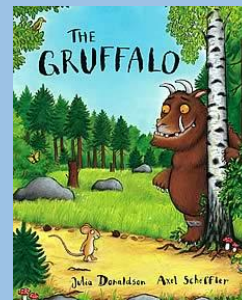
Physical Features: ponds, rivers, trees, woods.
