| By the end of this unit pupils will know what a simile is, and use similes to compare one thing to another. | By the end of this unit pupils will write a character description based on their own Ninjabread Man character. They will choose ingredients and explain the effects of these on their character's appearance and personality. They will use the key vocabulary from the core text to write simple, compound and complex sentences about the original Ninjabread Man and also apply their spelling rule knowledge to spell most words accurately. "The Ninjabread Man" is a fiction story which is a twisted fairy tale and based on the traditional tale of The Gingerbread Man. It follows a couple of retired Japanese ninja warriors who decide to bake themselves a gingerbread child. They go to the fox who tells them to add lemon to make him speedy, ginger to make him sneaky and hot wasabi powder to make him brave. Little do the old couple know, their Ninjabread Man will cause them all sorts of trouble!
