## What is past tense?

Introduce

Something that happened in the past.

Miss Mather jumped out of bed.

We walked to school.

Mrs Harrison watched her favourite film.

Introduce

(5 mins)

**Verbs** can be past tense or present tense.

A **present tense verb** is an action that is happening **now**.

swallowing    jumping    shouting    walking

A **past tense verb** is an action that is happened **in the past**.

swallowed    jumped    shouted    walked
