Attendance & Punctuality Attendance target 2024–25: 97.5%. Currently school is at 97.3% (97.4% last week). Remember reduced % means 'Learning time lost'! A reminder that the chief medical officer encourages children to attend school if they have a cold, however if they have sickness, or diarrhoea, they need to remain absent for 48 hours after the last time this occurs. If your child has a temperature, they need to remain off school. Attendance as often as possible is important for your child. Punctuality: It is important that you aim to be in school for the start time. This is 8.55am in Foundation Stage and 9am in Y1 and Y2. This is the time your child needs to be on the	

carpet, things put away ready for register and to learn, not when you are arriving at the	
entrance. Arriving late is disruptive to both your own child and the rest of the class. It is also	
likely your child will have missed some key learning for the day.	
This week 0.50% of children were marked as late.

This week the children have really enjoyed visiting the pantomime 'Robin Hood'. They joined in with cheering, singing, and boo-ing in all of the right places and had a brilliant morning. We are excited to bring our panto experience into our learning after the Christmas holidays.

In maths, we have been counting, ordering and finding more and less with numerals to 5. We have been practising explaining our thinking in full sentences.

We wrote recipes for reindeer food and made this using biodegradable glitter, made Christmas cards and calendars, and decorations for our Christmas trees. We are excited to share these with you when we bring them home next week.

Each class has earned their bee treat this week for following our school values and class charters. The children have been voting for their class treats, and can't wait for them to happen next week!

Y1 (Hedgehogs, Squirrels and Foxes)

English – We have learning how to use "and" to extend sentences and make them even more interesting for the reader

Maths – We have continued our leaning on subtracting and addition using the crossing out method and we have used our problem solving skills to solve both addition and subtraction equations.

History – We have been comparing our grandparent's toys with our own and identifying differences and similarities.

Science – Considering signs of winter and comparing it to Autumn.

Music – We have done our dress rehearsal for our Christmas play.

Computing – Creating digital paintings

Y2 (Woodpeckers, Kingfishers and Eagles)

English –. We have writen our setting descrition of a winter wonderland, using our senses to think about what we imagine we would see, hear orfeel.

Maths – We have identified vertical lines of symmetry in 2D shapes.

Science - We carried out an experiment to find out which material would protect an egg the best.

Computing – Anti bullying – we talked about who we could tell if we saw something online we didn't like,
