#### Attendance & Punctuality

Attendance target 2024–25: 97.5%. Currently school is at 97% (97.5% last week). Remember reduced % means 'Learning time lost'!

A reminder that the chief medical officer encourages children to attend school if they have a cold, however if they have sickness, or diarrhoea, they need to remain absent for **48 hours** after the last time this occurs. If your child has a temperature, they need to remain off school. Attendance as often as possible is important for your child.

**Punctuality**: It is important that you aim to be in school for the start time. This is **8.55am** in Foundation Stage and **9am** in Y1 and Y2. This is the time your child needs to be on the carpet, things put away ready for register and to learn, not when you are arriving at the entrance. Arriving late is disruptive to both your own child and the rest of the class. It is also likely your child will have missed some key learning for the day. This week **0.82%** of children were marked as late.

## Ladybirds

This week the children have continued to explore our focus text "The Three Little Pigs". We have enjoyed pretending to be "The Big Bad Wolf" to create collabartive blow art, observing the primary colours and what happens when those colours mix together. The children have loved ordering the key events in the story and orally retelling the story using Ipads, building the little pigs homes using large construction and investigating objects that will blow over versus ones that won't and why that might be.

### Foundation Stage Two (Otters, Mice and Badgers)

This week the children have enjoyed making colour books using a variety of different media and materials. They have explored colour mixing, and how different resources on different materials (e.g. paint onto paper, or pastel onto fabric).

We have continued our learning about 'Robin Hood', and enjoyed writing clues about characters from the story for our friends to guess who is hiding. We have had some brilliant clues, like 'He is greedy' about the Sheriff of Nottingham, and 'They live in the forest' about the Merry Men. The children have thoroughly enjoyed listening to their friends reading out each clue and trying to guess which character was chosen.

In maths, we have been exploring the mass of different objects. Children have used balance scales to understand this concept. We have really focused on reading the scale correctly, ensuring that each side is equal, and using our star word 'balanced' to describe this.

As part of our learning about 'The Natural World', children have observed changes of state using ice. They predicted whether the ice would melt quicker inside or outside, and explained why this might happen. The children enjoyed using the warmth of their hands to melt the ice, and talked about how this felt.

Everyone has loved using our outside classroom again now that the ice and snow has melted. The children have been riding balance bikes, building dens, painting ice, and making castles.

#### Y1 (Hedgehogs, Squirrels and Foxes)

**English** – We have read our new text The Great Explorer and explored some new vocabulary, including: ice, water, polar bear, North Pole and Northern Lights. We have thought about what we like about the story and have rated how much we liked the story out of 10. We have been recapping how to form curly caterpillar letters correctly.

**Maths** – We have practiced ordering numbers to 20 and representing numbers within 20, using different resources.

**History** – We had a special History lesson, where we pretended that we were passengers on the Titanic. We learned that the Titanic was supposed to be 'unsinkable' but it crashed into an iceberg and sank.

**Music** – We have learned a new song 'Hey You!' which is about rhythm and pulse. We have practiced finding the pulse in songs and singing the words together as a group.

**Computing** – We have been using Bee Bots, which are small robots. We can use algorithms to make the Bee Bot move.

**RE** – We have learned about Judaism and have looked at special artefacts.

## Year 2 (Woodpeckers, Kingfishers and Eagles)

English –. We have started our new twisted fairytales topic and reading our new books "The Three Little Narwhals".

Maths – We have started our money topic, making amounts in different ways and adding coins together.

**PSHE** – Thinking about different family types.

History – Acting out the Sheffield flood of 1864 at the Dale Dyke Dam.
