#### Attendance & Punctuality

**Attendance** target 2024-25: **97.5%.** Currently school is at **967.7%** (**97.1**% last week). Remember reduced % means 'Learning time lost'!

A reminder that the chief medical officer encourages children to attend school if they have a cold, however if they have sickness, or diarrhoea, they need to remain absent for **48 hours** after the last time this occurs. If your child has a temperature, they need to remain off school. Attendance as often as possible is important for your child.

**Punctuality**: It is important that you aim to be in school for the start time. This is **8.55am** in Foundation Stage and **9am** in Y1 and Y2. This is the time your child needs to be on the carpet, things put away ready for register and to learn, not when you are arriving at the entrance. Arriving late is disruptive to both your own child and the rest of the class. It is also likely your child will have missed some key learning for the day. This week **0.74%** of children were marked as late.

# **Ladybirds**

The children have enjoyed making their Easter Bonnets for the parade in the making area. Many of the children have been keen to practice writing their name or initial sound this week to label their creations and drawings. We have also enjoyed mark making in flour and glitter this week, practicing some pre-writing shapes. We know many knew performance poems and have enjoyed practicing 'Pancakes', 'Popcorn' and 'Spring Wind'.

## **Foundation Stage Two (Otters, Mice and Badgers)**

In Drawing Club this week, children have been immersed in the world of animation with Mr Benn as a Zookeeper. Many children have been writing sentences or captions for their word codes to bring their drawings alive.

All the classes have taken part in planting in the top yard and our tyre planters are looking lovely in the Spring sunshine. Children will be tending to them and there are lots of conversations around caring for them and growth. Children have enjoyed making Easter bonnets for the parade and are excited about showing them off.

Read Write Inc. assessments have taken place this week and children continue to make progress with their phonic knowledge.

# Y1 (Hedgehogs, Squirrels and Foxes)

**English** – We have designed our own dragon to plan for writing a fact file. We also used exclamation sentences to make our writing more exciting – remembering to use exclamation marks.

Maths – We have found half of quantities, a quarter of shapes and a quarter of quantities.

**Computing** – We have been using 'Scratch junior'

**RE** – We have learnt about parables which are stories that Jesus told to Christians. This week we have been thinking about how Jonah would have felt in the parable 'Jonah and the Big Fish'.

PE - Dance and net games.

History – We have discussed how people would be felt during the Great Fire of London in 1666.

**Geography** – We learned about how people celebrate St Patrick's Day.

RHE – we have discussed what makes us angry and how this feels

# Year 2 (Woodpeckers, Kingfishers and Eagles)

**English** – We have started writing up our under water fact file. This week, we have been writing about the appearance and applying conjunctions to our writing to make the sentences exciting.
