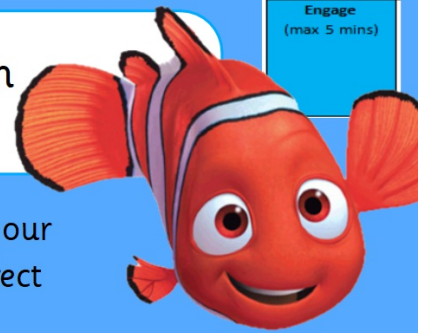

Apostrophes for possession - to show something belongs to one person

Helens skirt was pretty.	Helen's skirt was pretty.
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The dogs lead is red.	The dog's lead is red.
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What does omission mean?

Apostrophes for omission
(to show missing letters)

Insert an apostrophe to show a letter or letters, have been taken away.

It is too hot for me.

It's too hot for me.

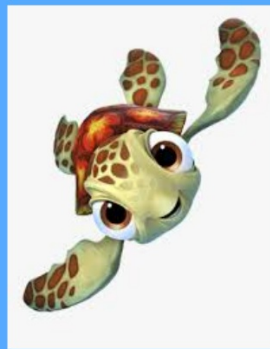

Finding Nemo

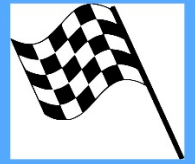
Marlin wasn't sure where to search by himself, so he asked Dory to help. He told Dory all about the diver's mask, and how it would lead them to Nemo.
