What does the word 'responsibility' mean?



Introduce

What does the '*perfect*' family look like...

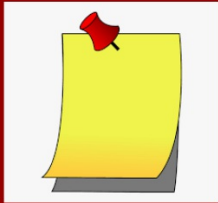
It doesn't exist! All families are different - and that's what makes us special. There may be some tricky moments in our families, but every member of a family should try and make it a nice place to be!

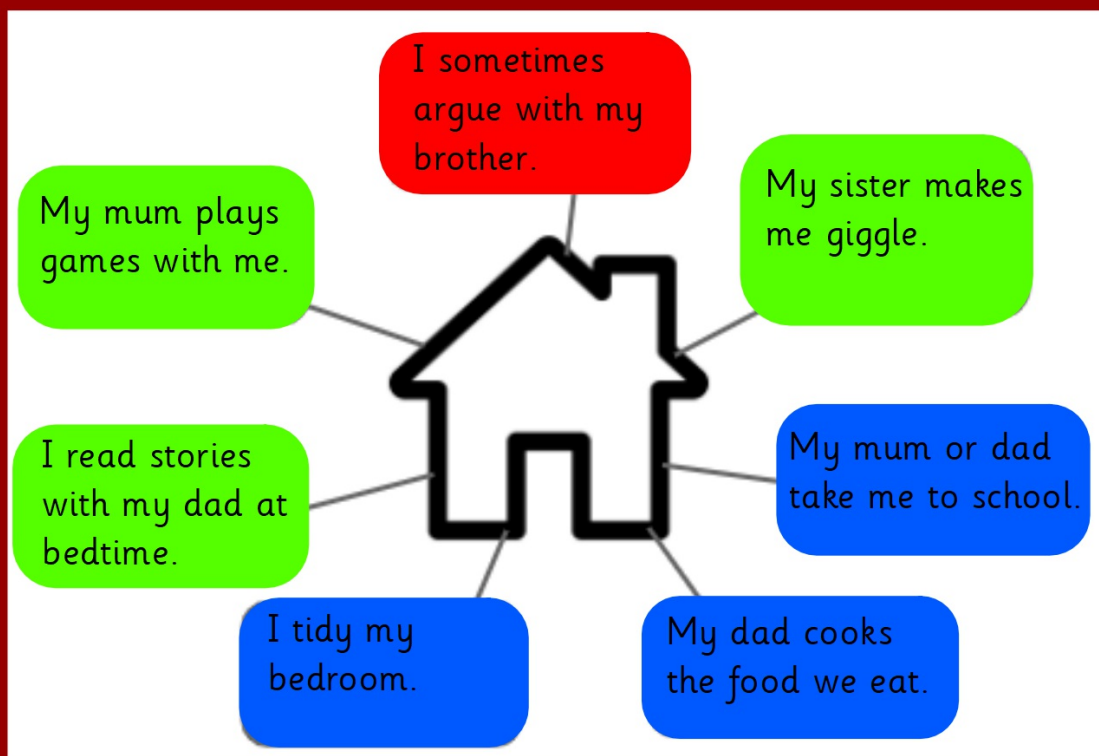
Things that are not perfect about my family.
