What is a simple sentence?



The rules...

Simple sentence...

A simple sentence needs:

- * Needs a subject (noun) and a verb.
- * **Capital letter at the start.**
- * **Full stop (or end sentence punctuation) at the end.**



Ask for somebody to read you the text aloud.
Can you hear where the full stops go?

The second time they read it, bob down when you think it is the end of a sentence.

This is a simple sentence because...

Charlie - noun
walked - verb
