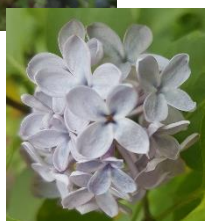
BBC bitesize video - What plants can you see outside?

Take a walk or have a look in your garden to see what plants you can find. Have a go drawing them in a box. When you have found 9 shout **PLANT BINGO!**

(You may be able to pick a few, and put them in your boxes instead, but only if; they are on the ground, there are a lot of them, or if they are a weed - Check with a grow-up if you are not sure you can pick them.)

If you can't find enough/many flowers here are some pictures some of the teachers have found on their walks around parts of Sheffield, draw these or cut them out and stick them in a box



Sometimes people like to press flowers- You can use a flower press or a heavy book and some paper.

How to press a flower:

Put a piece of paper either side of the flower, and place it underneath a heavy book (or a few books if you do not have a heavy one).

You will have to leave them for a few days.

Here are some we pressed at home:

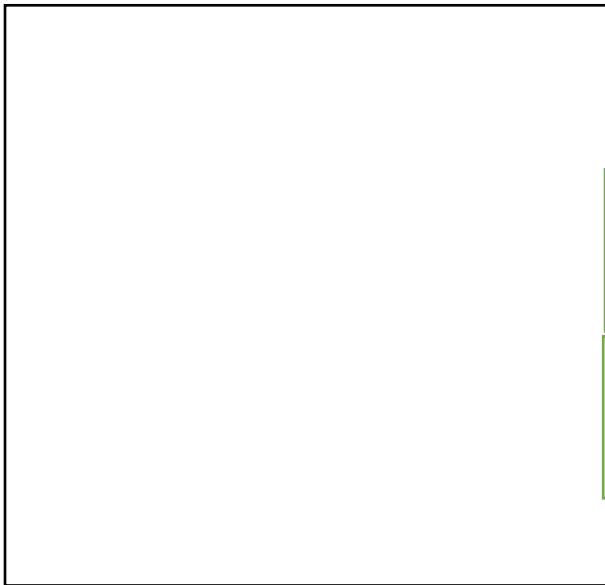


What do your flowers look like when they have been pressed?
